KCC KELLOGG COMMUNITY COLLEGE Early College Program

Early College is a tuition-free college program that enables students to earn a high school diploma and college credits toward a KCC Associates Degree or technical certificate at little to no cost for students or their families.

Why Was Early College Created?

- Make college an affordable option for more students and families;
- Provide a gradual, structured and supported transition from high school to college;
- Create a strong incentive for students to pursue career pathways needed to sustain and grow the local economy;

 Establish a collaborative network between high schools, the community college and local industries to produce a workforce with the technical and employability skills desired by employers.

Who Can Participate?

Early College is available to all interested students that attend districts that currently partner with KCC for Early College. However, there is an intentional focus on those who have traditionally been under served—especially those who are at-risk of not completing high school, are economically disadvantaged or the first in their families to attend college.

How/When Can Students Apply?

Students apply for this program during their sophomore (10th grade) year of high school. If a student is interested in their high school's Early College program, they will need to schedule a meeting with the Early College contact at their high school.

How Does It Work?

Students have to be accepted into their high school's Early College program no later than the first high school count day of their junior (11th grade) year. Depending on the student's high school schedule, they will begin their first college course first semester of the junior year. Here is an example of how many courses an Early College student may enroll in each year:



Sarah knew she wanted to do something in the medical field but was unsure of the specialization. She enrolled in the Health Occupations program at the CACC because it allows students to explore various careers like radiography, veterinary science and dental hygiene, among others. Sarah is very interested in helping people but wants to do it in a way that is different from nursing. Currently employed as a Certified Nursing Assistant, she plans to attend KCC for prerequisites and transfer into the Dental Hygiene program. In the future, she hopes to become a dentist, or potentially an orthodontist, and is hoping to find an employer that wants to support her education in the future.

What You'll Learn & Do

Dental hygienists clean teeth, examine patients for signs of oral diseases such as gingivitis, and provide other preventive dental care. They also educate patients on ways to improve and maintain good oral health. The tasks hygienists may perform, and the extent that they must be supervised by a dentist, varies by state and by the setting in which the dental hygienist works.

Day to Day Tasks

- Examine gums, using probes, to locate periodontal recessed gums and signs of gum disease
- Chart conditions of decay and disease for diagnosis and treatment by dentist
- Apply fluoride or other cavity preventing agents to arrest dental decay
- Feel lymph nodes under patient's chin to detect swelling or tenderness that could indicate presence of oral cancer

Individuals who enter the EMS profession enjoy helping others and are willing to work under stressful conditions as a health care worker. Depending on the needs of the student and level of care they wish to provide, various EMS Program offerings are available, ranging from a single class to a two-year degree.

Students can begin exploring Emergency Medical Services by entering the EMT Basic program at the Calhoun Area Career Center. This program, offered in collaboration with Kellogg Community College, is the entry point for individuals who are interested in working on the ambulance in the pre-hospital setting, those interested in a career where they need to be trained as a first responder, or students that may have an interest in becoming a paramedic.

Kellogg Community College offers an Associates in Applied Science degree (71 credit hours) in EMS, which allows students to complete their education at the associate-degree level by adding some general education courses to their Basic EMT and

Emergency medical technicians (EMTs) and paramedics care for the sick or injured in emergency medical settings. People's lives often depend on the quick reaction and competent care provided by these workers. EMTs and paramedics respond to emergency calls, performing medical services and transporting patients to medical facilities.

Day to Day Tasks

- Assess the nature and extent of illness or injury to establish and prioritize medical procedures
- Administer first aid treatment or life support care to sick or injured persons in pre-hospital settings
- Operate equipment, such as electrocardiograms (EKGs), external defibrillators, or bag valve mask resuscitators
- Coordinate work with other emergency medical team members or police or fire department personnel



Kellogg Community College offers an Associates in Applied Science degree in PTA and prepares students to take the National Physical Therapist Assistant **Examination required for licensure in most states.** The five-semester sequence of classes is recommended for full-time students. The PTA program provides students with working knowledge of and thorough testing regarding the theories behind treatment protocols and pathological conditions being treated and provides understanding of the modalities and machinery which are used to treat those conditions.

What You'll Learn & Do

Physical therapist assistants, sometimes called PTAs, work under the direction and supervision of licensed physical therapists. They help patients who are recovering from injuries and illnesses regain movement and manage pain. Physical therapist assistants are involved in the direct care of patients. Physical therapist aides, however, perform tasks that are indirectly related to patient care, such as cleaning and setting up the treatment area, moving patients, and performing clerical duties.

Day to Day Tasks

- Instruct, motivate, safeguard, and assist patients as they practice exercises or functional activities
- Observe patients during treatments to compile their responses and progress and provide results to physical therapist in person or through progress notes
- Communicate with or instruct caregivers or family members on patient therapeutic activities or treatment plans
- Confer with physical therapy staff or others to discuss and evaluate patient information for planning, modifying, or coordinating treatment

Early Childhood focuses on children's growth and development between the ages of birth and 8 years. An elementary school teacher provides instruction to children in preschool through the sixth grade and helps them to develop social skills and positive learning habits. A secondary school teacher conducts classes in specific academic subjects or skills.

Students can explore various opportunities in education by entering the Early Childhood Education (ECE) and Education Academy programs at the Calhoun Area Career Center — depending on their specific interest and aspirations. Students have the opportunity to earn their Child Development Associates (CDA) credential in ECE, which requires two years in the program with additional hours working with children from ages 3 to 5 years old.

Kellogg Community College offers an Associates of Applied Science degree in Early Childhood Education, an Associates of Elementary Education and training for students interested in careers in secondary education. Many students use specific courses to meet the

Located within the First Congregational Church, Ashanti is currently a lead teacher in her own classroom (Young 3's) at the Garden of Dreams Community Preschool here in Battle Creek. In this role, she observes students in her class and plans lessons to help them develop their skills and prepare them for pre-school. Ashanti wants to one day open her own child care center and is considering doing so in her hometown.

What You'll Learn & Do

Childcare workers provide care for children when parents and other family members are unavailable. They attend to children's basic needs while also reading and playing with babies and toddlers to introduce basic concepts such as manners. Childcare workers help preschool-age children prepare for Kindergarten. Alternatively, teachers educate students at various grade levels to build fundamental knowledge/skills that prepare them for life after high school.

Day to Day Tasks

- Establish a nurturing learning classroom and maintain a safe play environment
- Support children's emotional and social development, encouraging understanding of others and positive self-concepts
- Keep records on individual children, including daily observations and information about activities, meals served, and medications administered
- Communicate with children's parents or guardians about daily activities, behaviors, and related issues




Criminal Justice is the delivery of justice to those who have committed crimes. Law Enforcement/Criminal Justice programs focus on the major areas of criminal law, procedures, and corrections.

Students can explore and prepare for careers in criminal justice, law enforcement, corrections and other related fields at the Calhoun Area Career Center. Students will be exposed to law enforcement investigations, including specialty areas within police work and will learn about what happens in the court of law, including the role of the Judge, Prosecutor, Defense Attorney, Expert Witness and Victim Advocate.

KCC offers an Associates in Criminal Justice degree, which is designed to be transferable to many fouryear institutions, as several career positions require a four-year degree for employment. For students interested in Law Enforcement, KCC's Police Academy is well respected and offers an excellent schedule. Many students have commented that if it were not for the academy schedule, they would have been

unable to attend a police academy and fulfill their dream of becoming a law enforcement officer. An Associates in Applied Science degree in Law Enforcement is awarded at the end of the police academy.

Originally inspired by the father of a good friend who worked in public safety, he realized quickly that this career field was a good fit for him. He excelled in both the CACC Law Enforcement program and the Police Explorer Program with the Battle Creek Police Department. When asked what he likes best about the career choice, he reflects on his commitment to making his community a better place. Tylon's ambitions go beyond just becoming a patrol officer. As a current member of the Cadet Program with BCPD, he is eager to continue on this path and ultimately build a fulfilling career.

What You'll Learn & Do

Police officers protect lives and property. They pursue and apprehend people who break the law. They then warn, cite, or arrest them. Most police officers patrol their jurisdictions and investigate suspicious activity. They also respond to calls, issue traffic tickets, and give first aid to accident victims. Detectives and criminal investigators, who are sometimes called agents or special agents, gather facts and collect evidence of possible crimes. They perform investigative duties, such as gathering facts and collecting evidence.

Day to Day Tasks

- Provide for public safety by maintaining order, responding to emergencies, protecting people and property, enforcing motor vehicle and criminal laws, and promoting good community relations
- Record facts to prepare reports that document incidents and activities
- · Monitor, note, report, and investigate suspicious persons and situations, safety hazards, and unusual or illegal activity in patrol area
- Testify in court to present evidence or act as a witness in traffic and criminal cases

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ASSOCIATES DEGREE — An undergraduate academic degree usually earned in two years or more. This can be attained at community college, technical college, vocational school and some colleges.

BACHELORS DEGREE — An undergraduate academic degree usually earned in four to seven years. This can be attained at colleges and universities.

CERTIFICATE — A document granted upon the successful completion of a certificate program, typically taking less than two years to complete.

CERTIFICATION EXAM — Often referred to simply as "Certification," this exam assures an individual is qualified to perform a job or task, generally following educational training.

COLLEGE — Any program or training which earns you a degree/credential that can help you find meaningful employment after high school.

COOPERATIVE EDUCATION (CO-OP) — Student placement in a business/ industry related to their educational training, through which the student earns pay and credit.

CREDIT HOUR — Unit of measuring educational credit, usually based on the number of classroom hours per week throughout a term or semester.

DUAL ENROLLMENT — A student enrolled in high school and at least one college course at the same time.

GRADUATE DEGREE — An advanced academic degree granted after six or more years of studies. This can be attained at university-level graduate programs. Examples include Master's and Doctoral degrees.

INTERNSHIP — On-the-job work experience that is related to your career interests or current field of study, internships can be paid or unpaid.

JOB OUTLOOK — A forecast of the change in the number of people employed in a particular occupation over a set period of time.

LICENSE — Provides permission by a competent authority to engage in a business or occupation

MEDIAN HOURLY WAGE — Wage estimate between the highest paid 50% and the lowest paid 50% of workers in that occupation; half of the workers in a given occupation earn more than the median wage and half the workers earn less than the median wage.

SOFT SKILLS — Personal attributes that enable someone to interact effectively with other people. Examples include communication, professionalism, punctuality, attitude, conflict resolution, etc.
